Homebound vaccines will be available to anyone having difficulty coming to a scheduled clinic. Homebound vaccines will be available for any family member or caretaker. Please call Jill Sweet to schedule a homebound vaccine. We will have regular dose flu, high dose flu for anyone 65 years of age and older, and a limited supply of egg free flu vaccine. We plan to offer COVID vaccines with the newest recommended dose. Once those are available to order we will make that option available in COLOR.
